Regional & Local Significance Taxa Status

Re = Taxa that are considered to be regionally significant within south-east Queensland/Noosa Shire.

L = Locally significant taxa. Includes taxa that are considered regionally significant based on selection criteria, although considered to be of lower conservation

significance within the Shire than priority taxa.

Priority & secondary taxa status/selection criteria include:

REG = Regionally significant taxa based on listing as near threatened, data deficient, uncertain, indeterminate, restricted, conservation dependent, potentially threatened or insufficiently known by National and State fauna threat assessments or by relevant authorities.

RE = Restricted taxa. Taxa that are considered to be restricted as they are thought to have a restricted distribution or are strongly associated with habitat types that display a restricted distribution in the Noosa Shire or region based on known habitat preferences, distribution and numbers of available records.

END = Endemic taxa. Taxa that are known to be endemic to the southeast Queensland/Northern NSW bio-region are considered to be regionally significant endemic taxa

Specific habitat feature dependent taxa = Includes taxa that are considered regionally significant due to a requirement for specific habitat features, such as hollows, caves, fissures or other structures, or particular roost or nesting sites that may either be vulnerable to disturbance and/or limited in availability. Sub-categories include:

HD = Hollow dependent taxa

RS = Roost site dependent taxa

VDIS = Vulnerable to Disturbance taxa. Taxa that have been identified as vulnerable to disturbance by relevant regional studies (McFarland 1997; Gilmore & Parnaby 1994).

Taxa of Regional Biogeographic Significance = Taxa that have a significant biogeographic occurrence within the Shire or within the region. Sub-categories include:

SDL = Southern Known Distributional Limit

NDL = Northern Known Distributional Limit

U = Uncommon. Taxa that are uncommon, restricted or rare in coastal habitats due to decline or natural distributional patterns

INV = Inland vagrants. Taxa that are considered uncommon vagrants within the Noosa Shire, with major known distribution/habitat in inland areas west of the Dividing Range.

VAG = Taxa that are considered vagrant species within the Shire, or have an unpredictable occurrence.
